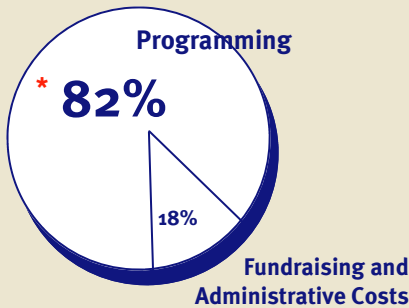

EMERGENCY & BASIC NEEDS (THE SALVATION ARMY)



Hundreds of Union County families don't know when the welcome mat will be pulled out from under their feet. They are living in temporary situations or trapped by rent payments above their means because of a lack of affordable housing.

The Salvation Army's Homeless Prevention Program served 92 people (including 47 children) in the first quarter of 2010. 100% of them were able to maintain permanent housing through rent or utility assistance.

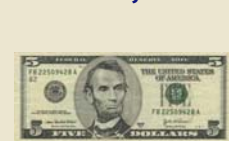

YOUTH SERVICES (NORTH STAR CENTER)



Richwood youth have a new gathering place at the North Star Center, where more than 200 kids have engaged in positive, structured, activities since the center opened in 2009. Field trips, homework help, volunteer projects, and fun are offered.

The same kids who reported this youth was 'bad' soon got to know him and befriended him. His attitude changed. He recognized that he didn't need to act out to get attention."
